Peter Burley is a Principal Planning Inspector with the Planning Inspectorate, an Executive Agency of the Department of Communities and Local Government. He has undertaken a number of Local Plan Inquiries and deals with both large and smaller scale appeals covering a wide range of the work undertaken by the Inspectorate, including planning, enforcement, tree preservation orders, commons, rights of way and advertisement appeals. Between June 2004 and July 2006 he worked firstly in a managerial and then in a training role at the Inspectorate's head office in Bristol.

Prior to joining the Inspectorate in 1989 his career was in local government working for a number of metropolitan and rural authorities in both England and Wales. His work covered both forward planning and development control but also implementation and environment roles, including work as a nature conservator with responsibility for both an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and a Heritage Coast. He was also involved in developing and opening a country park and was for a time a member of the Working Panel of Local Authority Ecologists.
